

Other typescript indexes for the main cemeteries cover Beverley Queensgate East Riding Mental Hospital (Broadgate) burials for 1911-1994, Beverley stillborn children 1927-1974, Beverley Queensgate Garden of Rest 1981-1997 and Bridlington burials in war graves 1939-1948.

We have also created an alphabetical index to the draft lists of entries into the Pocklington burial registers for 1857-1887 (draft lists reference PC52/64). Pocklington Town Council holds the original Pocklington cemetery registers. Other typescript indexes cover Crowle Cemetery 1863-1985, Grimsby Ainslie Street Burial Ground 1855-1943 and Willerby Kingston upon Hull Borough Asylum Burial Ground 1887-1907.

Records Available Elsewhere

Information about the records of other civil cemeteries in the present East Riding of Yorkshire and Filey is available from the appropriate parish or town council. Records of the Hull civil cemeteries are held at the Hull City Archives, 79 Lowgate, Hull, HU1 1HN and Chanterlands Crematorium, Chanterlands Avenue, Hull, HU5 4EF (both at www.hullcc.gov.uk). CEMETERY RECORDS

This guide provides information about the cemetery records which we hold and the finding aids available to access them. It includes also information about similar records held elsewhere.

Background

Most people were buried in a Church of England graveyard until the middle of the 19th century. Public cemeteries administered by local authorities came into use as the population grew and the churchyards became overcrowded. Most cemeteries were owned and managed by district, town or parish councils.

Cemetery registers can contain details such as the person's age, address, profession and when they died. A summary list of the cemetery registers deposited here is given on the next page. More detailed information is available in our Online Catalogue which also contains supplementary records such as registers of purchased graves and grants of grave spaces. Details of the Anglican burial registers held here are also included in the Online Catalogue and in our handlist of Anglican registers, which is available onsite and on our website.

The more recent civil cemetery records are kept by Cemeteries Administration at Scoot Building, Beckview Road, Grovehill Road, Beverley, HU17 0JT (www.eastriding.gov.uk).
